- POSITION:** Assistant/Associate Professor of Agricultural Economics, tenure track, academic year appointment.
- EFFECTIVE DATE:** January 1, 2018 or until filled
- QUALIFICATIONS:** Earned Doctorate or ABD (all but dissertation) in Agricultural Economics or related field required, with a strong background and interest in farm management, marketing, policy and agricultural business. Areas of interest to include, but are not limited to; agribusiness management, policy, farm management, risk management and agricultural marketing. A strong interest and skills in undergraduate and graduate teaching and advising are essential. The applicant should have demonstrated abilities to communicate effectively and to work well with others.
- RESPONSIBILITIES:** The position will be an academic year appointment (100 percent teaching) with duties administered by the Department of Agriculture, Geosciences and Natural Resources. Teaching responsibilities may include online and traditional classes in the following areas; Farm Management, Agricultural Marketing, Agricultural Policy, International Trade, Agribusiness Management, and Entrepreneurship. The successful candidate would be expected to assist in training the National Agri-Marketing Team and AAEA Quiz Bowl Competition Team.
- SALARY:** Commensurate with qualifications and experience.
- THE DEPARTMENT:** The Department of Agriculture and Natural Resources at UT Martin offers Bachelor of Science degree programs in Agriculture, Geosciences, and Natural Resources Management. Concentrations in Agriculture include: Agricultural Business, Agricultural Education, Agricultural Science, Animal Science, Plant and Soil Science and Agricultural Engineering Technology. Concentrations in Geosciences are Geology, Geography, and Meteorology. Concentrations in Natural Resources Management include: Wildlife Biology, Park and Recreation Administration, Environmental Management and Soil and Water Conservation. Pre-professional programs are offered in Forestry, Agricultural Engineering, and Veterinary Medicine. Current enrollment is about 944 students with 28 full time faculty and staff members. The Department operates a 650-acre teaching farm complex to support applied faculty research and student experiential learning opportunities.
- THE UNIVERSITY:** UT Martin is one of four primary campuses of The University of Tennessee System. Located in northwest Tennessee, the campus has an enrollment of approximately 6,900 and a faculty of about 250. UT Martin has an established reputation as a superior quality undergraduate institution with programs of study leading to degrees in more than 65 specialized fields.
