This is an Assistant Professor of Agribusiness position within the School of Agriculture at the University of Wisconsin-Platteville. It will be a 9-month tenure track faculty appointment. Primary responsibilities will include teaching and advising undergraduate students in Agribusiness. Teaching responsibilities will focus on the area of commodity marketing including Agricultural Commodity Marketing, Livestock and Meat Marketing and Price Forecasting.

- Teaching undergraduate courses in agribusiness, specifically agricultural commodity marketing.
- Advising students and clubs/organizations within Agribusiness.
