POSITION DESCRIPTION

This is a nine-month, non-tenure-track faculty lecturer position. The position has renewable annually up to two years based on performance, need, and funding. The successful candidate will teach undergraduate courses in agricultural communications. In particular, the candidate should have experience and expertise in written and oral communications in the context of agriculture, food, the environment, and natural resources. Preferred starting date is January 3, 2023.

MAJOR RESPONSIBILITIES

This faculty member will teach four sections of AGCM 3203 – Oral Communications in Agricultural Sciences and Natural Resources (three on-campus sections) and engage in appropriate service activities for the department, college, university, and profession.

QUALIFICATIONS

The successful candidate must have an earned master's degree in agricultural communications or a closely related field. Applicants should demonstrate potential for excellence in teaching and scholarship of teaching in the discipline.

SALARY AND BENEFITS

Salary and benefits are competitive based on qualifications and experience. Retirement and long-term disability, medical, dental and life insurance programs are available to employees.

ABOUT THE DEPARTMENT

The department's undergraduate programs are organized into three majors: agricultural education, agricultural communications, and agricultural leadership. Graduate degrees offered include the Master of Agriculture in Agricultural Leadership, Master of Science in Agricultural Education, Master of Science in Agricultural Communications, and Doctor of Philosophy in Agricultural Education. Nearly 400 students are enrolled in undergraduate and graduate programs in the department.
